SERMON

Grace and peace, you who are prepared and you who are surprised, you who are in danger of nodding off and you who are awake. God's grace and peace be with you all.

Every now and then while I'm sleeping, I have a recurring nightmare. Each time it happens, the nightmare isn't exactly the same, but when I wake up, I recognize immediately— THAT dream has happened again— the nightmare where I'm unprepared.

My recurring dream always involves travel. I'm just about to take off on a wonderful trip, heading to the airport or seaport, about to get on an airplane or ship to travel abroad. And then it happens. I realize that I'm already on my way there, but I don't have my ticket, or I've forgotten to bring my passport, and I don't have any time to turn around to get it without missing my departure.

I like to be prepared, so it's distressing to be caught unprepared, especially when- in my dream - I've already invested a lot of money & effort to go on that trip, with no way to correct my mistake.

That dream leads me to prepare carefully for every trip— Do I have everything I need? Am I preparing far enough ahead of time so I don't need to scramble at the last minute? Just the memory of that recurring dream is all the warning I need to be prepared.

How do you react to the parable Jesus tells us today? It's a little distressing to have Jesus tell us to keep awake, to watch for him, lest we be left behind. It is a call to us to be prepared.

We know Jesus loves us. He doesn't give us this warning because he wants to condemn us. Jesus wants us to be prepared to celebrate with him at his holy feast. Maybe Jesus gives us this warning so we'll use wisely what seems like too much waiting time.

Waiting. That describes a lot of our lives these days. Months of waiting due to this virus. Waiting for months to hug loved ones. Waiting extra days for our mail to arrive. A long election campaign, and days of waiting for the results. Waiting and waiting for everything to get back to normal. Waiting... and waiting... and waiting.

Are the foolish among us those who had too little toilet paper in their homes, or too much? Those who took the Covid warnings to heart, or those who tried to continue life as normally as possible? I don't know if there are any wrong answers— you'll have to be judge and jury.

In this year, this dark time in our lives, what will fuel us while we wait for our Lord? What has sustained Christians during dark times in the past still are blessings for all of us now, even during Covid.

Prayer- on your own or with others, from a book or from your heart.

Reading the Bible through Bible studies or daily reflection on a passage of scripture.

Worshiping our Lord in simple ways, wherever you are.

Encouraging others to be faithful.

Serving those who need any kind of help.

Giving to help others, person-to-person or through your church.

And Inviting others to join you in the life of faith.

May these ways to live out our faith fuel your faith and bless your life as we continue to wait for this darkness to end, and our joyful reunion as people of faith. Amen
